



## LEAF COLLECTION BEGINS MID-OCTOBER

The Township will begin collecting leaves in mid-October and will continue until Nov. 27, the day before Thanksgiving, weather permitting.

Residents are asked to rake leaves into the street, a foot or so away from the curb or edge of pavement. Piles should not exceed three feet in height and four feet in width. Piles that contain tree branches or any other debris **WILL NOT BE PICKED UP** until the debris is removed. Debris damages equipment, and repairs are costly.

Residents are also asked to park vehicles or trailers in their driveways. If it is not possible to park in your driveway, a vehicle or trailer should be parked away from the leaf piles. **It is also imperative that contractors do not place a pile of gravel or other material on a roadway that obstructs the collection of leaves.** Leaf piles blocked by vehicles or contractor material will not be picked up until the following week, providing they have been moved.

Leaves that are raked into the street after the equipment has passed will not be picked up until the following week. If you use a landscaper to remove leaves from your property, please advise them of the collection schedule and require them to adhere to collection policies.

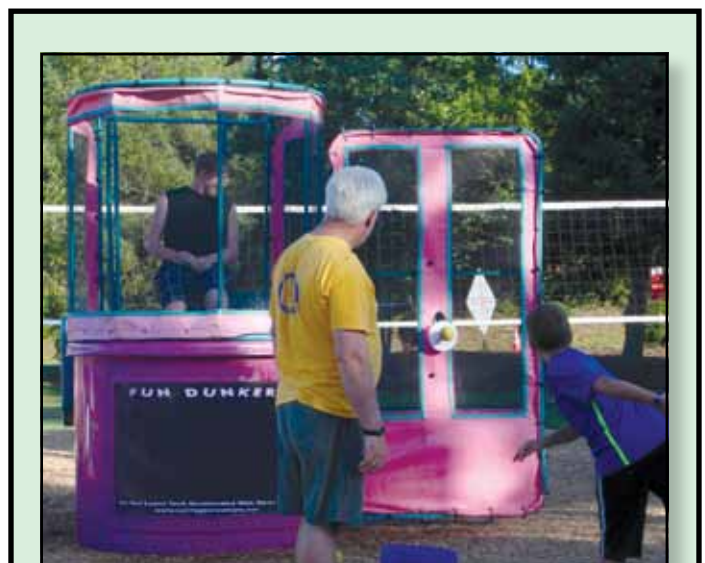

### PLANNING COMMISSION

The Planning Commission took the following actions at its September meeting:

- Recommended that a request from Pinnacle Health to amend a provision of Chapter 27 of the Township Zoning Ordinance be denied.
- Recommended approval of a preliminary/final land development plan for Shepherd's Crossing, one lot on 3.6 acres at 201 Lamb's Gap Road, zoned Apartment-Office-Limited, owned by Team Rahal.
- Recommended approval of a preliminary/final land development plan for Landover, two lots on 4.3 acres at 4330 Valley Road, zoned Apartment-Office and Commercial Park Limited, owned by Fishing Creek Valley Associates.
- Recommended approval of a preliminary/final subdivision and land development plan for Twin Ponds West Fitness Center, two lots on eight acres at 200 Lamb's Gap Road North, owned by Patton Recreational Properties.

### ZONING HEARING BOARD

## Township Police Accepting Unused Prescriptions

Township residents can dispose of out-of-date and unused prescriptions and over-the-counter medicines in a special container, called "Med Return," that has been installed in the lobby of the Township Police Station at 230 S. Sporting Hill Road.

The Police Department lobby will be available for drop-off from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday and 8 a.m. to noon on Saturday.

Police Chief Harry Clay said that besides the prescription and over-the-counter medicines residents can also drop prescription patches, ointments, vitamins, sample medicines and pet medicines that are no longer being used into the container. He said labels can be removed from the prescription containers.

The Med Return container was purchased with funds donated by the VFW Post in Hampden Twp.

# BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Board of Commissioners took the following actions at its Aug. 29 meeting:

- ♦ Approved a conditional use application from the Capital Area Intermediate Unit for a 5,800-square-foot building at 4746 Delbrook Road, which will be used as an early intervention school for pre-school aged children. The school will serve children, ages 3 to 5, and will relocate from Walnut Bottom Center in Carlisle. Three classrooms will serve a maximum of 35 children at any given time.
- ♦ Approved a text amendment to the Township Zoning Ordinance for the purpose of regulating solar energy systems.
- ♦ Approved an Oct. 30 public hearing for a request from

## How to Use Billpayer When Paying Hampden

Residents who use their Bank Billpayer Service to pay bills must make sure that when they pay their Township **trash-sewer bill** that the amount is made payable to **Hampden Township Utilities** and includes the account number.

**The payment should be sent at least five business days before the due date because of possible delays at the banking institution. If the payment is postmarked after the due date a penalty charge is levied.**
