



Trash Collection Rate to Remain the Same

The Township Board of Commissioners has approved a two-year extension to the trash/recyclables collection contract with York Waste Disposal at no increase in cost to residents. The extension is effective Jan. 1, 2010 and will end on Dec. 31, 2011.

All phases of the contract remain unchanged from the existing contract, which went into effect on Jan. 1, 2007. The quarterly rate remains at \$44.25.

The contract also provides for the collection of large household items at curbside on a weekly basis. There are no limits on the number of large items but residents must give notice to the Township or York Waste for appliances

and other bulk items that are too heavy to be lifted by the regular collection crew.

Yard waste must be separated from regular trash and will be picked up by a separate truck, March 1 through Oct. 31. There is no limit on the number of trash bags that can be placed at curbside.

York Waste has been the Township's contracted trash and recyclables collector since the beginning of 2004.

Township Commissioners said they were pleased, because of the poor economic conditions plaguing the region and country, that York Waste granted the extension without raising rates.

Wildlife Habitat Certification Sought

Hampden Twp. Commissioners have approved a proposal to obtain a Community Wildlife Habitat certification for the Conodoguinet Youth Park off Orr's Bridge Road and for Armitage Golf Club.

The certification, sponsored by the National Wildlife Federation, is dependent upon the size of the community, according to Evan Jenkins, a Township resident who made a presentation on the initiative to the Board of Commissioners in April.

Jenkins said a community must have at least 150 homes, five common areas and five schools, plus at least 400 points which are achieved by completion of other community wildlife habitat projects. Hampden qualifies in each category, he said.

Penn State Master Gardeners in Cumberland County are working with Lisa Furlong and Girl Scout Troop 21-1358 to obtain the youth park certification. The golf course is a second common area to be certified and Master

Gardeners are working with students at Hampden Elementary School on a third project.

The certification requires that five essentials for life are provided: food, water, shelter, places to raise young, and sustainable gardening practices. Once certified, the property will be officially recorded at the National Wildlife Federation and a numbered certification mailed to the property owner.

Jenkins said community organizations are being solicited to participate in the initiative. More information is available from him at evan_jenkins@verizon.net.

Currently 31 communities in the nation have received certification and another 39 are working to obtain it.

Private Pool Rules

Residents who want to build a swimming pool on their property must adhere to Township regulations, whether the pool is in-ground or above ground.

All pools must be in the rear yard of the property, at least 10 feet from the property line. If the pool has more than 18 inches of water it must be encircled by a barrier at least four feet high, have gates or doors that are self-latching and have a locking device to the gate or door to keep it securely closed.

Pools that have direct access to a dwelling must have an alarm on the door to the pool that sounds when the door is opened.

Property owners are required to contact the Township to conduct a final inspection after the pool is constructed and before it is used.

Holiday Trash Collection

Because July 4 is on a Saturday, the collection of trash and recyclables will be collected under the normal Monday through Friday schedule during the week of June 29.

Residents are asked to place trash in weatherproof containers **on or behind the curb** before 6:30 a.m. the day of their trash collection, but no earlier than 6 p.m. the night before, to ensure it will be picked up.

Recyclables are to be placed in containers provided by the Township. **Containers should not be placed on a roadway.**

Curbside collection of bundled yard waste will continue until Oct. 31. Tree limbs cut into lengths of up to six feet and bundled for one person to carry will be picked up during regular trash collection by a different truck.

York Waste has announced that it will now pick up corrugated cardboard that is flattened and bundled and doesn’t exceed 3 feet by 3 feet in size. The cardboard will be collected with recyclables.

BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Board of Commissioners took the following actions at its April meetings:

- ♦ Adopted two ordinances relating to the purchase of energy supplies and services. One ordinance authorizes the Township to enter into an amended and restated Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement with Harrisburg and other participants regarding the bulk purchase of energy supplies and services. The second ordinance provides for an amended and restated Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement appointing the Municipal Utility Alliance, operated by the League of Cities and Municipalities, as a consultant to the Township on the bidding and purchasing of certain utility products and services. The Alliance is seeking to buy electricity in bulk in the hopes of saving money. Some 50 municipalities have expressed interest in the program.
- ♦ Formally approved the borrowing of approximately \$3 million, contingent upon its solicitor's review, to purchase PPL street lights in the Township. By buying the lights, it will eliminate an annual maintenance and service fee and further reduce costs by installing energy-efficient bulbs in all light standards. The savings will be used to pay off the loan.
- ♦ Accepted a nine-acre tract of land along Sears Run in the Silver Brook development, from Triple Crown Corp., that can be used by hikers, bikers and, the Board said, possibly cross-country skiers.
- ♦ Updated a sanitary sewer service agreement with Silver Spring Twp. Under the agreement, Hampden currently provides sewer service to 154 homes in Silver Spring.
- ♦ Authorized continuation of the Junior Commissioner program for the 2009-2010 school year.

- ♦ Authorized participation in the Capital Region Council of Governments joint cable franchise renewal process Austin Towner with Comcast, at a cost not to exceed \$4,725.
- ♦ Approved a preliminary/final land development and subdivision plan for Grandon Farms Phase IV, 26 lots on 14 acres, zoned Residential-Towne, at Sawgrass Lane and Crooked Stick Drive, owned by James E. and Jean Grandon.

- Food cans (please rinse; labels do not have to be removed)

BUNDLE OR PLACE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS IN PAPER BAGS:

- Corrugated cardboard – please flatten and cut into pieces no larger than 3 feet by 3 feet and bundle.
- Empty aerosol cans
- Newsprint, including slick inserts
- Construction paper, cereal, food boxes and paper towel rolls or similar
- Printer paper, computer paper, copy paper
- Junk mail
- Magazines and catalogs
- Telephone books

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS MAY NOT BE RECYCLED:

- Wax coated paper
- Materials with food debris
- Plastic bags
- Batteries
- Styrofoam
- Light bulbs
- Mirrors, window/auto glass, ceramics, cookware, bake ware, drinking glasses
- Wood
- Unnumbered plastics
- Coat hangers
- Appliances
- Hazardous or toxic substances.
