



Township Resumes Delivery Of Tanbark, Compost

The Township will resume delivery of tanbark and compost to residential properties, while supplies last. Orders will be accepted beginning Sept. 1, with deliveries scheduled to begin the week of Sept. 14. The program will end Oct. 16, when curbside leaf collection begins.

Due to the limited quantity of tanbark, residents are asked to check the Township's website or call 761-0119 for product availability before placing an order.

The fee to have either product delivered is \$50 for up to eight cubic yards. The leaf compost or tanbark will only be placed on the driveway.

Both items are available free of charge to residents at the Yard Waste Facility, which is accessible from Technology Parkway. Residents must load the material themselves without the use of power equipment. The facility is open from 7:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday and from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. on the first and third Saturday of each month through the first weekend in January.

Residents who want delivery service must complete an order form and release agreement and make payment at the Township Building. Visa and MasterCard can be used for payment. The agreement form is available at the Township website under "on-line forms."

The leaf compost or tanbark will be delivered as soon as possible after the application, release agreement and payment are received.

After 50 years of service in the Township, the Hampden Civic Club has disbanded. Finding it more difficult to get new members, the Club voted in March to disband.

Over the half century of its existence, the Club worked on community projects that, in many cases, generated revenue for thousands of dollars in scholarships. It also received many State Federation awards for programs and money-making activities.

It was instrumental in forming the Township Ambulance Association and is remembered by many for the afghan it designed and sold depicting historical sites in the Township.

As a final gesture in March, it donated the remaining funds in its treasury, \$2,161, to the Township Volunteer Fire Company.

Holiday Trash Collection

Trash and recyclables will be collected a day late the week of Sept. 7 because of the Labor Day holiday. Trash will be collected on the normal schedule on Columbus Day, Monday, Oct. 12, and the remainder of that week.

Residents are asked to place trash in weatherproof containers **on or behind the curb** before 6:30 a.m. the day of their trash collection, but no earlier than 6 p.m. the night before, to ensure it will be picked up.

Recyclables are to be placed in containers provided by the Township. **Containers should not be placed on a roadway.**

Curbside collection of bundled yard waste will continue until Oct. 31. Tree limbs cut into lengths of up to six feet and bundled for one person to carry will be picked up during regular trash collection by a different truck.

York Waste has announced that it will now pick up corrugated cardboard that is flattened and doesn't exceed 3 feet by 3 feet in size. The cardboard will be collected with recyclables.

State Assures Township Chloramination Is Safe

The Secretary of the State Department of Environmental Protection, in a letter to the Township Board of Commissioners, calls the use of chloramines in the local drinking water “a well-established disinfection technology...that is used extensively in the water supply industry. More than 60 million people in the United States receive drinking water that is treated with chloramines.”

Secretary John Hanger sent the letter after the Township asked for written assurance that the use of chloramines will provide safe drinking water to residents and businesses.

Secretary Hanger told the Board that DEP “has a rigorous review process for permit applications submitted by public water supply systems.” He said DEP, with input from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the State Department of Health, “responds to industry and public concerns over the use of all treatment chemicals, including chloramines.

He said chloramines “can produce less disinfection byproducts than use of chlorine alone, and chloramines are very effective at maintaining disinfection throughout a water supply distribution system.”

The use of chloramines in the water supplies on the West Shore stirred controversy in the past year, with opponents claiming the chemical is unsafe.
