



Veteran Officer Appointed Township Police Chief

The Township's Board of Commissioners has appointed Harry K. Clay, Jr., a 31-year veteran of the Township Police Department, as Police Chief, succeeding Michael A. Andreoli, who retired in January.

Clay was Andreoli's assistant since 2005 when he was promoted to Lieutenant. He joined the Department as a patrol officer in 1979 and was in that position until 1986 when he was promoted to Criminal Investigator. From 1990 to 1994, he was a narcotics investigator and was detached to the multi-county unit under the Attorney General and District Attorneys from Cumberland, Perry and York Counties.

He returned as Patrol Supervisor in 1994 and was subsequently promoted to Corporal in 1995. In 1999, he was promoted to Sergeant and Criminal Unit Supervisor and served in that position until 2005.

He has been the Department's Firearms Instructor, Field Training Officer and the instructor for drug field-

testing kits. Since 1986, he also served with the Capital Region Forensic Unit and the Cumberland County Drug Task Force.

Clay is a graduate of Susquehanna High School, has an Associate Degree in Police Administration from Harrisburg Area Community College, is an honor graduate of the 20th Police Academy and attended the basic and advanced Police Executive Development School.

He is a four-year veteran of the U.S. Air Force, where he served as a medic and was an honor graduate of two technical schools. He and his wife of 33 years have four children.



Township, Camp Hill Discuss Sewer Options

The Borough of Camp Hill, which was discussing for the past several years whether to stay with Lemoyne Sewer Authority, is now interested in possibly paying Hampden for the treatment of its wastewater.

Hampden received a letter from Camp Hill Borough Manager Gary Kline asking if the Township would be interested in providing sewer treatment to Camp Hill.

Hampden's Board of Commissioners authorized Township staff to enter into discussions with Camp Hill to determine whether the treatment of wastewater can be shared.

According to Commissioner John V. Thomas, cooperating with the Township might be the most cost-effective option for Camp Hill.

Camp Hill decided in February to sever ties with Lemoyne. Its options

now are to build its own wastewater treatment plant or join Hampden. It must comply with sewage treatment regulations under the Chesapeake Bay strategy. Hampden's Roth Lane wastewater plant is undergoing multi-million dollar upgrades to meet the Bay requirements.

Camp Hill, according to Hampden, has approximately 4,000 households and businesses.

Recycling Update

New residents billed for sewer and trash service who need a recycling container can get one free of charge at the Township Building. **A replacement container, or additional container, will be provided for \$10.**

York Waste, the Township's collector of trash and recyclables, has updated the list of items that residents, who are billed by the Township, can recycle:

- Aluminum food and beverage containers (please rinse; labels do not have to be removed)
- Plastic containers with symbols 1 through 7.
- Glass (clear, brown, green) food and beverage containers (please rinse and remove lids; labels do not have to be removed)
- Empty aerosol cans - PLEASE PLACE IN RECYCLING CONTAINER.

BUNDLE OR PLACE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS IN PAPER BAGS:

- Newsprint, including slick inserts, magazines, catalogs, junk mail - **All items can be placed in the same bag.**
- Construction paper, cereal and food boxes, or similar
- Printer paper, computer paper, copy paper
- Telephone books
- Corrugated cardboard - please flatten and cut into pieces no larger than 3 feet by 3 feet and bundle.

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS MAY NOT BE RECYCLED:

- Wax-coated paper
- Materials with food debris
- Plastic bags
- Batteries
- Styrofoam
- Light bulbs, compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs). (Residents can ask about recycling CFLs at the location where they were purchased.)
- Mirrors, window/auto glass, ceramics, cookware, bake ware, drinking glasses
- Wood
- Unnumbered plastics
- Coat hangers
- Appliances
- Hazardous or toxic substances.

Wildlife Certification Could be 1st in State

Hampden Twp. volunteers are working to make Hampden the first community in Pennsylvania to be a Certified Wildlife Habitat Community. There are only 31 communities certified in the U.S.

The certification, sponsored by the National Wildlife Federation, has many elements to complete. One is for 150 Hampden homes to be certified as a Backyard Wildlife Habitat. Currently, 39 homes have been certified. Certification requires providing the five essentials for life: food, water, shelter, places to raise young and sustainable gardening practices.


Compost Still Available

The Township no longer has tanbark available for delivery but still has a limited quantity of leaf compost available for delivery. Orders will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis, while quantities last.

The delivery charge is \$75 for any amount between one and eight cubic yards. The compost will only be placed on the driveway of the property.

Tanbark and compost are available for pickup, free of charge, from 7:30 a.m. to 3 p.m., Monday through Friday, at the Yard Waste Facility at the Public Works Facility, which is accessible from Technology Parkway. A resident ID card will be required to access the facility. Check the Township website for updates on the future availability of tanbark and compost.

Residents who want the delivery service must complete a release agreement and make payment at the Township Building. The agreement form is available at the Township Building or on the Township website under "online forms."

Photo ID Card Required For Resident Discounts

The Township's Resident ID Card, which is used for discount rates at the pool and Armitage Golf Course, **can be obtained, free of charge, at the Recreation Department, 5001 Park Street Extended, across from Sporting Hill Elementary School.** The card is also required to use the Township's yard waste collection facility.

The Recreation Department is open from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

The card entitles a resident to \$4 off greens fees and \$1 off weekend/holiday cart fees, excluding nine holes, at Armitage, and \$2 off daily admission fees at the pool on weekdays and \$5 on weekends.

Private Pool Rules

Residents who want to build a swimming pool on their property must adhere to Township regulations, whether the pool is in-ground or above ground.

All pools must be in the rear yard of the property, at least 10 feet from the property line. If the pool has more than 18 inches of water it must be encircled by a barrier at least four feet high, have gates or doors that are self-latching and have a locking device to the gate or door to keep it securely closed.

Pools that have direct access to a dwelling must have an alarm on the door to the pool that sounds when the door is opened.

Property owners are required to contact the Township to conduct a final inspection after the pool is constructed and before it is used.

Residents and commercial property owners who experience a sanitary sewer blockage are reminded to call the Township before calling a plumber. Calls should be made to the Roth Lane Wastewater Plant at 761-7963.

The Board of Commissioners took the following actions at recent meetings:

- ♦ Heard a report from Public Works Department Director Steven S. Campbell that costs associated with the Feb. 6 and Feb. 9/10, 2010, snowstorms totaled \$193,263. He also said that 46 employees participated in mid-February in state-conducted snow plow training, including four from other departments who received in-house light-truck training.


PLANNING COMMISSION

Carlisle Pike Work To End in Late July

The repaving of almost a mile of the Carlisle Pike, from just east of the Salem Church Road intersection to near the Van Patton Drive intersection, is expected to be completed by the end of July, according to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation.

The \$966,141 state-financed project, which began in March, includes road milling and the replacement of the surface.

Lane closures are scheduled from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. One lane of traffic will be open on each side.

Holiday Trash Collection

Trash and recyclables will be collected a day late the week of May 31 because of the Memorial Day holiday.

Residents are asked to place trash in weatherproof containers **on or behind the curb** before 6:30 a.m. the day of their trash collection, but no earlier than 6 p.m. the night before, to ensure it will be picked up.

Recyclables are to be placed in containers provided by the Township. **The first container will be provided to new residents, free of charge. Replacement containers will be provided for \$10 per container. Containers should not be placed on a roadway.**

How to Use Billpayer When Paying Hampden

Residents who use their computer Bank Billpayer Service to pay bills must make sure that when they pay their Township **trash-sewer bill** online that the amount is made payable to **Hampden Township Utilities** and includes the CN account number.

The payment should be sent at least five business days before the due date because of possible delays at the banking institution. If the payment is received after the due date a penalty charge is levied.

Motorized Bike Warning

Township Commissioners are reminding residents that the use of motorized vehicles (bicycles, scooters, etc.) is prohibited on bike/walking paths and sidewalks in the Township as it is a violation of state law.

Motor scooter includes small motorcycles, mini-bikes, mini-cycles, pocket bikes and pocket rockets, as well as motorized standing scooters. State law states that a motor scooter must be registered, inspected and insured before it can be operated on a public road.
